# Scientific Awards

## Overview

The Knee Society annually presents three (3) scientific awards for papers submitted from the various training programs or from practicing orthopaedic surgeons, both members and non-members, for presentation at the **Specialty Day Meeting of The Knee Society (during the AAOS Annual Meeting)**.

Top 3 papers are selected for the following awards:

- **The Chitranjan S. Ranawat, MD Award** (with a \$1,000 honorarium).
- **The John N. Insall, MD Award** (with a \$1,000 honorarium).
- **The Mark B. Coventry, MD Award** (with a \$1,000 honorarium).

Any and all of these awards are granted at the discretion of the Program Committee of The Knee Society.

*The deadline to submit a full manuscript in consideration for an award is*

***November 15, 2021.***

The **presenting author** of each winning paper will receive an honorarium and a certificate. His or her co-authors will receive copies of certificate.

## Instructions to Contenders

A paper submitted for consideration to The Knee Society **may not** also be submitted to The Hip Society, whose cycle and process is similar. If a study is relevant to both hip and knee, submitters must choose **only one Society** to submit to.

Submitted papers must:

- Be blinded.
- Highlight quality basic science or clinical research specifically related to the knee joint.
- Be completely original work and **not be submitted to, and/or published in whole or in part in**, any journal or via electronic media platform **prior to presentation at Specialty Day**.
- May be previously presented, in whole or in part, if the new submission represents an important contribution.

*Journal of Arthroplasty (JOA)* is the official journal of The Knee Society, and all submission must be done online through: <https://www.editorialmanager.com/joa/default.aspx> . Please select “Knee Society Award” for the article type. In addition, in the Cover Letter, please state the paper is for consideration of a Knee Society Award.

## If Your Paper Receives an Award

1. The presenting author for the paper will be registered as The Knee Society faculty; this registration is complimentary for **Specialty Day**.
2. The Knee Society does not reimburse any travel expenses associated with this presentation.
3. The presenting author will be assigned a time slot on the program, typically 8-10 min.
4. The presenting author is responsible that he/she and all the co-authors have updated the financial disclosures through the AAOS Orthopaedic Disclosure Program: [www.aaos.org/disclosure](http://www.aaos.org/disclosure).
5. The presenting author will receive an award certificate and an honorarium of \$1,000 at the time of your presentation. **The presenting author (or the individual whose name is on the award check) is responsible for any taxes due on this additional income.**
6. Publication:

The award-winning manuscript will be formally submitted to *The Journal of Arthroplasty (JOA)* for peer review as per *JOA*'s standard procedures. Please note that although The Knee Society has chosen a paper for a scientific award, it still has to go through the review process which will likely ask questions, may request significant changes, and does not absolutely guarantee publication. The *JOA* editorial publishing team will be in touch directly regarding further steps and deadlines.

**It is the expectation of The Knee Society that an award-winning paper will be published in *JOA* as part of The Knee Society's Proceedings. The authors must make a good-faith effort to have their paper published.**

**Please do not submit your paper for publication in any other journal.**

If your paper is not accepted for an award, as it will be formatted for *JOA* submission, the authors will have the option of having the Society and Journal directly submit the manuscript for consideration of publication in another *JOA* issue. The *JOA* is punctual yet thorough in its review process and would appreciate the opportunity to review your manuscript for publication in a regular issue of the Journal.
